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1. Cognitive Radio



- Cognitive Radio will bring phenomenal change in the way wireless communication worked.
- It can be seen as intersection between wireless technology and computational intelligence.
- The cognitive radio is defined as intelligent wireless communication system built on a software-defined radio, which is aware of environment and uses methodology of learning from the environment and adapt to statistical variations in the input signal to provide highly reliable ubiquitous communication and efficient utilization of radio spectrum.



Need and Importance of Cognitive Radio




- Spectrum Scarcity due to spectrum hungry wireless technologies.
- Present legacy based spectrum management and control structure which does not allow spectrum reuse or sharing.
- Numerous applications generate deluge of data.
- Importance of cognitive radio lies in the need for optimal use of scarce spectral resources.
- Emergence of reconfigurable systems is the prime motivation for cognitive radio.



The Cognitive Cycle







The Cognitive Cycle



• The cognitive cycle is an important component of the Cognitive radio which imparts the environment awareness and adaptability to radio.

•This consists of the functionalities such as

- 1. Spectrum sensing: The signal transmitted by Primary user is detected and processed to detect the spectrum holes for opportunistic use by SUs.
- 2. Spectrum analysis: Characteristics of the spectral holes are estimated.
- 3. Spectrum decision: Data rate, modulation method and the bandwidth of the transmission is determined by the radio.



Communication Limits in Cognitive Radio



- Primary user protection from interference due to secondary transmission.
- Multipath fading.
- Hidden node problem.
- Secondary user receiver sensitivity.
- Limit on secondary transmit power





- Exploiting the spectrum opportunity (frequency bands) at particular time and particular location without interfering legacy users.
- Sensing of signals having different formats.
- Sensing wide spectral band.
- Handling hidden node problem.
- Sensing within minimal time and frequency of sensing.

• To manage hardware requirements.



Detection and the State-of-the-art



The following are the enabling algorithms for sensing.

- Matched filter detection
- Energy detection (radiometry)
- Cyclostationary feature detection
- Radio identification based sensing
- Waveform based sensing





Cooperative Sensing

- Hidden node problem is major hindrance in sensing for cognitive radio.
- Cooperative sensing is an evident solution.
- Secondary users cooperate in sensing the transmission by primary user and the information is known to each user irrespective of its location.
- Cooperative sensing can limit the local interference threshold requirement.

- Limited focus on other parts of the cognitive cycle




My Focus
